A delegation from the Samahan sa Pilipinas ng mga Industriyang Kimika (SPIK), paid a courtesy visit to the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) on January 16, 2025. The meeting aimed to address ongoing issues and concerns about the requirement for a 100% composition declaration in Safety Data Sheets (SDS) for the evaluation of chemical imports by the Customs Anti-Illegal Drugs Task Force (CAIDTF).

The SPIK delegation, spearheaded by President Engr. Gretchen F. Enarle and other directors, Engr. Aldrich Bentilanon, Mr. Jose Racquel Santos and Ms. Mary Grace San Jose together with Ms. Antonette Fallarme, engaged in constructive talks with PDEA representatives, including Ms. Agnes Mandap, Director of Compliance Service, Mr. Edgar Reino, Chief of LRD Compliance Service,

Mr. Roberto T. Caladiao, and Ms. Aileen Tuliao.

The gathering fostered a positive atmosphere, highlighting the collaborative efforts to ensure regulatory compliance and combat the illicit drug trade without hindering the legitimate chemical industry's operations. Both parties expressed their commitment to work together to find practical solutions that balance safety and business interests.

The meeting also highlighted the importance of open dialogue between government agencies and the private sector to achieve common goals efficiently.

These professionals are set to lead the chemical industry association in the forthcoming administration year (AY) 2025. Additionally, the board of directors has been enriched with the





Enhancing Chemical Security in Southeast Asia's SMEs through Supply Chain Sustainment







ENHANCING CONTROLLED CHEMICALS REGULATION: TWG MEETING ON RA 9516 IRR



The Technical Working Group (TWG) on Controlled Chemicals, comprising key stakeholders from the Samahan sa Pilipinas ng mga Industriyang Kimika (SPIK), Integrated Chemists of the Philippines (ICP), Department of Science and Technology- Industrial Technology Development Institute (DOST-ITDI), and the Philippine National Police- Firearms and Explosives Office (PNP-FEO), gathered virtually on January 23, 2025. This meeting was hosted by the DTI- Board of Investments and facilitated by Mr. Ronaldo DC. Buluran, the Acting Director of Manufacturing Industries Service.


The main focus of the meeting was the line-by-line review and discussion of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act 9516, which pertains to the regulation and monitoring of controlled chemicals. The event underscored the importance of updating these rules to cater to the evolving needs of the chemical industry, ensuring safety and security while fostering growth and innovation. The collaborative approach of the TWG is essential for addressing concerns and developing guidelines that balance chemical industry growth with public safety considerations. This meeting is anticipated to pave the way for a more robust and efficient regulatory framework that will significantly impact the sector's future.

SPIK AND PICHE COORDINATION MEETING: FINALIZING GHS WEBINAR AND RESPONSIBLE CARE WORKSHOP

In a collaborative effort to strengthen the chemical industry's knowledge and compliance, the Samahan sa Pilipinas ng mga Industriyang Kimika (SPIK) and the Philippine Institute of Chemical Engineers (PIChE) held a coordination meeting on January 23, 2025. Conducted online, this meeting focused on finalizing preparations for two significant events: a webinar on the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals (GHS) and an in-person workshop dedicated to Responsible Care.

The GHS webinar, set for February 26, 2025, aims to provide information governing chemical handling and safety. Following closely on March 26, 2025, the Responsible Care workshop will convene industry professionals to promote sustainable practices and environmental stewardship within the sector. Both occasions are anticipated to be instrumental in fostering a culture of safety and environmental consciousness among local chemical engineers and stakeholders.







The Responsible Care Council (RCC) held its strategic planning session on January 24, 2025, with the aim of aligning its projects and activities with the Philippine Chemical Industry Roadmap. Under the leadership of Director and Responsible Care Chairman Engr. Reinier Bagabay, and with the support of RC Tri-cord Member Director Malou Formalejo and Vice President Engr. Albert Samuela, the Council members discussed and prioritized their initiatives for the year. Key topics on the agenda were the upcoming RC verification process, the enhancement of corporate social responsibility (CSR) efforts, and the expansion of training programs.

Their collective insights and expertise were crucial in shaping the Council's strategies to promote environmental stewardship, health, safety, and security within the chemical sector.

The strategic plan for 2025 also emphasized the importance of collaboration with various stakeholders. These partnerships are expected to strengthen the Council's advocacy and outreach efforts, ultimately contributing to the sustainable growth of the Philippine chemical industry.

SPIK Engages with World Bank for Chemical Industry Supplier Development Program
